

Polisario threatens to target consulates and airports in Morocco

The Polisario front, like the Algerian officials, continue their threats to wage war in Morocco. Since the endorsement of resolution 2602 of the Security Council, and their plan to manipulate the content of the resolution fallen into the water, the two parties to the conflict in the Sahara have increased declarations of war against the Kingdom.

After the appeal of the former soldier to retire, Said Mediouni Mokhtar, launched to the separatists of the Polisario on an Algerian television channel, aiming to commit terrorist attacks in Morocco in particular in Casablanca and Marrakech and to “sow terror” among the Moroccan people, other figures of Algerian politics have continued this momentum.

The president of the National Democratic Rally (RND) – which is historically part of the ruling coalition alongside the FLN – Tayeb Zitouni, called during a party meeting to “overthrow the Makhzen regime” criticizing the reestablishment of diplomatic relations between Morocco and Israel.

When Algeria does not apologize for terrorism in Morocco, it is the revolution that it would like to provoke there. The Polisario, the armed wing of Algiers, does not seem to escape the rule since one of its officials said that companies, airlines and foreign consulates based in the provinces of southern Morocco “are potential targets of armed attacks” by the Polisario.

The Polisario, which publishes war communiques almost daily and unilaterally withdrew from the ceasefire after some of its elements carried out acts of piracy and blocked the only passage linking Morocco to Mauritania for almost a month in 2020, assumes with confidence his terrorist nature in an interview with Mohamed El Ouali Akik in the British newspaper The Economist.

“A deeper attack must be launched on Moroccan territory”, he threatened, affirming that it is “more than a simple possibility”.

Faced with these verbal attacks and these serious explicit threats to carry out terrorist acts in Morocco and against foreign representations as well as private groups, the Algerian government has not reacted, thus revealing its complicity in the facts.

These threats do not intend to remain without consequences since a group of Moroccan citizens has seized Interpol for these threats, according to the newspaper Altayar.
